Head Coach Mark Davis

Head Coach Mark Davis enters his first year at the helm of the Men's and Women's Soccer team after developing the program during the summer of 2016.

Coach Davis has a long history of successful coaching. Over the last three years he has been the head coach for the Seasiders at BYU-Hawaii. He led his men's team to a .609 (15-8-9) overall winning percentage and .740 (15-3-7) percentage in the Pac-West. His team has made a top four conference finish three seasons in a row achieving back-to-back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in school history. He was named the PacWest Coach of the Year in 2013. Mark is the all-time winningest coach in BYU-Hawaii men's soccer history.

Mark has strong ties in Utah, he attended Copper Hills High School where he started on the varsity squad all four years while also serving as the team caption for two years. Davis won a state cup with The Utah Rangers his U 18 year; He also played in the Utah State Olympic Development Program for four years. Mark Davis is a founder of Olympia Football Club in Heber City, Utah.

Mark is the current head coach of Real Salt Lake women's soccer team. He was named the head coach for the 2016 season. He was named UWS West Coach of the Year for his efforts during the 2016 season. In 2015 the RSL women won the WPSL Elite National championship.

Coach Davis played at Iowa Western College and led the team to a conference championship in 2009. He went on to graduate from BYU-Hawaii and moved to Concordia University-Irvine where he gained his master's degree in coaching and athletic administration.

Personal...He served a two-year LDS mission in Tampico, Mexico 2006-08...Fluent in Spanish... Mark is married to his wife Natalie and has two children Dax and Rudy.



Assistant Coach Brittney Crump

Brit begins her first season on the SLCC Soccer staff. Coach Crump is a SLCC alum who played on the Bruin soccer team when it was still a club. Brittney transferred to BYU-Hawaii where she continued her soccer career and graduated with a bachelors' in exercise and sports science.

During her time at BYU-Hawaii, Brit was honored with an All-Pac West Conference Second Team award in 2012 and All-Pac West Conference Honorable Mention in 2013.

Not only is she coaching the Bruins but she has played for the Real Salt Lake Women's soccer team for the last five years. She is also coaching youth competitive soccer for Olympia F.C. in Heber

City, Utah and has been coaching there for the past three years.

Brittney grew up in Layton, Utah and graduated from Layton High School. She is married to Cameron Crump.

The Lifetime Activities Center is home of the Salt Lake Community College Bruins. The "LAC" was dedicated in January 1996 by President Dr. Frank Budd. This building was built not only to give the Bruins a new home, but also to give the students at SLCC a state-of-the-art activity facility.

The LAC houses the Health and Lifetime Activities Department and the Athletic Department. Personal Training and Health and Lifetime Activities





programs are all a part of the LAC daily educational mission.

Special features of the LAC include a 5,000 seat special events arena, multiple class and meeting rooms, large multi-purpose playing area, six glass wall racquetball courts, dance studio, full service free weight room and cardiovascular fitness center.
