## Head Coach Sue Dulaney

Sue's coaching career spans over 34 years coaching at every level. Currently she is the longest and winningest coach at SLCC and while under her leadership the program has never fallen out of the NJCAA top 10 rankings. She has produced 19 consecutive 20 + win seasons.

She has always been in the Region 18 championship, winning 5 Region titles and 4 runner ups while at the helm of the Bruin volleyball program.

She began coaching at SLCC in 2008, where accepting the position meant the winning tradition and high expectations needed to be maintained. She was ready for the challenge and embraced all it had to offer. SLCC had the finest facility in the conference along with a stellar support staff. Success was soon to follow as she won the conference her first year in charge and was awarded Region 18 and NJCAA District A Coach of the Year.

During her 9 year career for the Bruins, she has personally been awarded the AVCA 300 career wins in 2011 and 400 career wins in 2015. In 2009, she was awarded NJCAA District A Coach of the Year, in 2010 NJCAA District B Coach of the year, 2013 Region 18 and NJCAA District A Coach of the Year, 2014 NJCAA District B Coach of the Year and 2016 NJCAA District A Coach of the Year. Seven times during Dulaney's career she has been nominated for the AVCA two year college West Region Coach of the year, 2016 was her year as she was selected to represent the West Region.

She currently coaches an Elite 16's team for Club GSL and was an evaluator for USA Intermountain High Performance in the spring of 2016.

Her college coaching career began in 2000 at Western Wyoming CC where she diligently worked to get the program back after a 20 year hiatus. Within one year she was recruiting the top Wyoming athletes and because of her efforts she was awarded Coach of the Year.

Her seven year stint at WWCC ended with a 245-111 record. Western Wyoming had a solid foundation to build on and a tradition of success. The athletic success at WWCC was complimented by there academic success as in 2006 and 2007 they were awarded AVCA All Academic teams.

Sue has been married to Stewart Dulaney for 26 years and couldn't have done it without his tremendous support. Stew serves as an adjunct professor for SLCC. Their two children will graduate with their Bachelors in May 2018. Dane will graduate from Colorado Mesa University with his Mechanical Engineering degree and Shea will graduate from the University of Utah with the Bachelors and \$\frac{4}{1}\$ visions of medical school.



## Assistant Coach Scott Keister

Scott Keister is currently entering his fifth season on the SLCC Volleyball coaching staff. Following the successful 2013 season for the Bruins, Keister was named the National Assistant Coach of the Year by the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) and has helped guide the Bruins to 3 National appearances in his first 4 years where the Bruins finished 4th, 5th and 9th and has also helped guide them to two region championships.

Keister brings a wealth of experience to SLCC Volleyball, having spent 17 years coaching the sport at various high-caliber collegiate, high school and club programs throughout the intermountain west. He came to the Bruins from Riverton High School volleyball program where he was the program's head coach. In his first season as head coach of Riverton High School, he inherited a program that was 7-19

the previous year and guided the Silverwolves to a 20-11 mark, the best in school history.

Prior to coaching at Riverton, Keister was an assistant coach at Montana State University in the Big Sky Conference from 2010-12. He is very familiar with the Utah landscape, having spent time coaching at multiple Utah institutions, including Westminster College and the University of Utah as a volunteer assistant. While at the U of U, Keister helped coach the Utes to a Mountain West Conference championship in 2003. He was also program director and USA Intermountain Region High Performance Director for nine years.

Keister is a technical coach that loves data and many aspects of the sport, with a diverse background and a love for working with middle and outside hitters. Scott was raised in Evansville, Indiana and attended both Ricks College (now BYU-Idaho) where he received his associate degree, and Weber State University where he obtained his bachelor's degree with a focus on physical education, coaching and history.

Keister and his wife Alicia have three beautiful daughters McKenna, Sophie, and Kendall.



## Assistant Coach Mackenzie Gromek

Mackenzie begins her third season on the SLCC Volleyball staff. Mackenzie graduated from Concordia University-Irvine in 2013 where she earned her bachelors degree in psychology. Gromek is an Agoura Hills, California native and began her playing career with Santa Monica Beach Club in 2004. She played her high school volleyball at Agoura High School where she lettered all four years.

As an Eagle at Concordia, Mackenzie was a key player on the 2011 NAIA National Runner-up team as well as the 2012 NAIA National Champion team that went 38-0. Gromek was a member of the Eagles squad that set national records with a 76 match

win streak between 2012-2013. The Eagles were Golden State Athletic Conference Champions from 2011-2013.

This season Gromek will focus on the development of Middle Blockers and overall team blocking. She will also be taking stats for the Bruins this season




