2018 Season Outlook

BRUINS HITTING GROOVE MIDWAY THROUGH TRAINING CAMP
TAYLORSVILLE, Utah (August 6, 2018) - Training camp is one of life’s trying times if you’re a student-athlete playing collegiate volleyball.
The learning curve is steep, the physical workload is heavy, and the expectations to improve are constant. All of those pressures are part of being a student-athlete, but the best training camps are able to water down the stress and mix in a healthy dose of team bonding and personal development. It should be no surprise that those training camps are run by veteran coaches like Salt Lake Community College’s Sue Dulaney.
The longtime Bruins volleyball coach admittedly runs a training program that is demanding but she uses the opportunity to build endurance in her players, and keeps the atmosphere fresh with various activities that challenge her players in a variety of different ways. The first week of Salt Lake’s camp has been fresh with positivity, as a focus on conditioning manifested itself on the court.
“The first week is always physically challenging,” said Dulaney, who is about to begin her 11th season in Taylorsville. “We do numerous tests to evaluate their overall fitness. We have a handful of players who crushed the tests, which shows they came prepared for the season. It’s always exciting for coaches to see players who are physically ready to compete.”
Dulaney also noted how several players have impressed her, including outside hitters Hellen Lacava, Ariane Pola and Utah native Ryley Daniel. She also praised the program’s setters for trying to adjust to new hitters.
SLCC’s workload will increase this week, as the Bruins add weight training to a regimen that already includes two-a-day practices. However, now that players understand the physical expectation of playing for Salt Lake, it’s time to add more of an emphasis on developing team chemistry.
Dulaney said the team participated in one-such activity last weekend.
“Team-building activities are important and many of the activities are player-driven as the coaches can only be involved in so many in a semester,” she said. “This last Saturday, the team took advantage of the new UTA pass attached to their ONE Cards and had a UTA challenge that took them all over the city, eventually ending up together at the Capitol.”
On the agenda for the Bruins this week is a hike to Lake Mary in the Wasatch Mountains, with several challenges being posed to the student-athletes along the way. Dulaney and her staff will also incorporate more off-the-court topics for conversation, including discussions of proper behavior and academic responsibilities as a Bruin student-athlete.
The workout pace will also change as individual skill development and film work become a more integral part of the team schedule, a schedule that evolves as the program gets closer to its Aug. 24 opener against Sheridan College.
“It is a lot to endure but once the season starts, it will be evident to our players why we did the things we did (in training camp),” Dulaney said.

Head Coach Sue Dulaney

Sue Dulaney is the most successful coach in the history of Salt Lake Community College’s volleyball program, adding several chapters to the program’s strong history.

A volleyball coach for the last 34 years, Dulaney’s program has been a mainstay in the NJCAA national rankings, with her leading the Bruins to five Region 9 titles and four runner-up finishes. She led SLCC to a share of the Scenic West Athletic Conference title in 2017.

As Dulaney enters her 11th season in Salt Lake, it’s easy to reflect on a past that has been filled with winning. The longtime volleyball coach first entered college coaching with Western Wyoming, leading the program from 2000-08. Dulaney compiled a 245-111 record with the program, leading them to the NJCAA National Tournament in 2004.

She started her career on the Wasatch Front with great esteem, leading the Bruins to the SWAC title in her first year. She has posted landmark wins during her career, including her 400th win during the 2015 season. Dulaney has also earned plenty of personal hardware in Taylorsville, earning six NJCAA district coaching awards.

Dulaney’s volleyball career began with a stellar prep career in Wisconsin, followed by an impressive career with the University of Wisconsin. After graduating with a teaching degree, she began her educational career in Wyoming, coaching volleyball, basketball and track with Campbell County School District.

She later left Wyoming to become the head coach at Battle Mountain High School in Vail, Colorado, where she established a successful club program. After a distinguished teaching career, Dulaney left for the Western Wyoming opportunity.

Besides her college coaching duties, Dulaney currently coaches an Elite 16 team for Club GSL and was an evaluator for USA Intermountain High Performance in the spring of 2016.

Dulaney is married to her husband, Stewart, who serves as an adjunct professor at Salt Lake Community College. The couple has two college-aged children, Dane and Shea.

Assistant Coach Scott Keister

Veteran assistant coach Scott Keister is in his sixth season with Salt Lake Community College’s acclaimed Volleyball program. A long-time volleyball coach on the West Coast, Keister joined the SLCC program after a tenure as the head coach of Riverton High School in the Salt Lake Valley.

Keister’s last collegiate stop was as an assistant coach at Montana State University, an NCAA Division-I institution in the Big Sky Conference. He also worked as part of the University of Utah program, learning from longtime Utah head coach Beth Launiere.

The longtime assistant has achieved much in both the club and collegiate volleyball scene, with several accomplishments in his tenure in Taylorsville. During Keister’s time in Salt Lake, the Bruins have won two Region 18 championships and earned the 2013 SWAC championship. SLCC also has participated in three NJCAA National Tournaments. He was named the 2013 AVCA National Assistant Coach of the Year.

Keister played collegiate volleyball at Ricks College in Rexburg, Idaho, earning an Associate Degree there. He then received an undergraduate degree from Weber State, in an integrated studies program that combined coaching, physical education and history.

An Evansville, Indiana native, Keister and his wife, Alicia, have three children – McKenna, Sophie and Kendall and Kelsey. He enjoys spending time with family and watching sports of all kinds when not coaching.



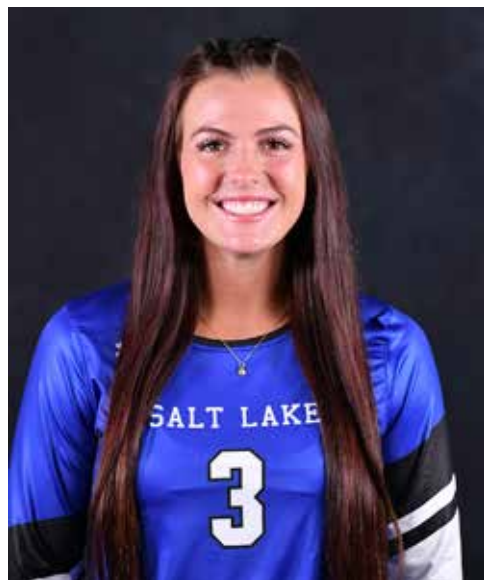
Assistant Coach Mackenzie Gromek

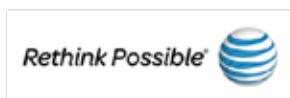
