Head Coach Sue Dulaney

Sue Dulaney is the most successful coach in the history of Salt Lake Community College's volleyball program, adding several chapters to the program's strong history.

A volleyball coach for the last 34 years, Dulaney's program has been a mainstay in the NJCAA national rankings, with her leading the Bruins to five Region 9 titles and four runner-up finishes. She led SLCC to a share of the Scenic West Athletic Conference title in 2017.

As Dulaney enters her 12th season in Salt Lake, it's easy to reflect on a past that has been filled with winning. The longtime volleyball coach first entered college coaching with Western Wyoming, leading the program from 2000-08. Dulaney compiled a 245-111 record with the program, leading them to the NJCAA National Tournament in 2004.

She started her career on the Wasatch Front with great esteem, leading the Bruins to the SWAC title in her first year. She has posted landmark wins during her career, including her 400th win during the 2015 season. Dulaney has also earned plenty of personal hardware in Taylorsville, earning six NJCAA district coaching awards.

Dulaney's volleyball career began with a stellar prep career in Wisconsin, followed by an impressive career with the University of Wisconsin. After graduating with a teaching degree, she began her educational career in Wyoming, coaching volleyball, basketball and track with Campbell County School District.

She later left Wyoming to become the head coach at Battle Mountain High School in Vail, Colorado, where she established a successful club program. After a distinguished teaching career, Dulaney left for the Western Wyoming opportunity.

Besides her college coaching duties, Dulaney currently coaches an Elite 16 team for Club GSL and was an evaluator for USA Intermountain High Performance in the spring of 2016.

Dulaney is married to her husband, Stewart, who serves as an adjunct professor at Salt Lake Community College. The couple has two college-aged children, Dane and Shea.

Assistant Coach Scott Keister

Veteran assistant coach Scott Keister is in his sixth season with Salt Lake Community College's acclaimed Volleyball program. A long-time volleyball coach on the West Coast, Keister joined the SLCC program after a tenure as the head coach of Riverton High School in the Salt Lake Valley.

Keister's last collegiate stop was as an assistant coach at Montana State University, an NCAA Division-I institution in the Big Sky Conference. He also worked as part of the University of Utah program, learning from longtime Utah head coach Beth Launiere.

The longtime assistant has achieved much in both the club and collegiate volleyball scene, with several accomplishments in his tenure in Taylorsville. During Keister's time in Salt Lake, the Bruins have won two Region 18 championships and earned the 2013 SWAC championship. SLCC also has participated in three NJCAA National Tournaments. He was named the 2013 AVCA National Assistant Coach of the Year.

Keister played collegiate volleyball at Ricks College in Rexburg, Idaho, earning an Associate Degree there. He then received an undergraduate degree from Weber State, in an integrated studies program that combined coaching, physical education and history.

An Evansville, Indiana native, Keister and his wife, Alicia, have four children – McKenna, Sophie, Kendall and Kelsey. He enjoys spending time with family and watching sports of all kinds when not coaching.



Assistant Coach Mackenzie Gromek

Mackenzie Gromek begins her 5th season on the SLCC Volleyball staff. Gromek graduated from Concordia University-Irvine in 2013, where she earned an undergraduate degree in psychology. Gromek is an Agoura Hills, California, native and began her playing career with Santa Monica Beach Club in 2004. She played her high school volleyball at Agoura High School, where she lettered all four years.

As an Eagle at Concordia, Mackenzie was a key player on the 2012 NAIA national championship team that went 38-0, also contributing to the 2011 national runner-up squad. Gromek was a member of the Eagles squad that set national records with a 76 match win streak between 2012-2013. The Eagles were Golden State Athletic Conference Champions from 2011-2013.

Gromek will focus on the development of middle blockers and overall team blocking. She will also be taking stats for the Bruins.

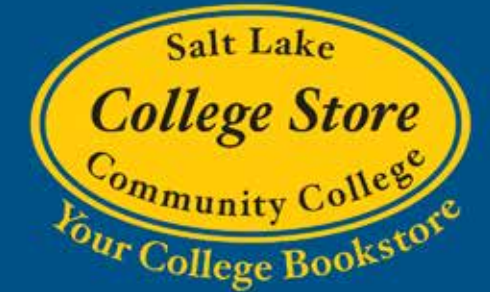
