#### **Head Coach**

#### **Mark Davis**

Mark Davis enters his fifth year at the helm of the SLCC men's and women's soccer programs after developing the program during the summer of 2016.

Davis has a long history of successful coaching at the collegiate level. The Utah native previously coached at BYU-Hawaii, working with the men's soccer program. He led his men's team to a .609 (15-8-9) overall winning percentage and .740 (15-3-7) percentage in the PacWest. His team has made a top four conference finish three seasons in a row achieving back-to-back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in school history. He was named the PacWest Coach of the Year in 2013. Davis is the all-time winning coach in BYU-Hawaii men's soccer history.

Davis has strong ties in Utah, as he attended Copper Hills High School, where he started on the varsity squad all four years as a high school player. He is is a founder of Olympia Football Club in Heber City, Utah.

Davis was also a head coach of Real Salt Lake women's soccer team. He was named the head coach for the 2016 season. He was named UWS West Coach of the Year for his efforts during the 2016 season. In 2015 the RSL women won the WPSL Elite National championship.

He played at Iowa Western College and led the team to a conference championship in 2009. He went on to graduate from BYU-Hawaii and moved to Concordia University-Irvine where he gained his master's degree in coaching and athletic administration.

Davis served a two-year LDS mission in Tampico, Mexico 2006-08 and is fluent in Spanish. He is married to his wife, Natalie, and has two children - Dax and Rudy.



## Assistant Coach Ty O'Connor


Ty O'Connor returned to the Salt Lake Community College Soccer coaching staff in January 2021 as the Men's Assistant Coach. Ty will also assist the Women's program whenever he can.

Prior to returning to SLCC, where he previously assisted both the Men's and Women's programs, Ty was the Associate Head Coach at Lincoln Trail College, a brand new Division I NJCAA Men's Soccer program. He has also coached youth soccer with the Illinois Fire Juniors, Salt Lake City FC, and the Pateadores Academy.

Originally from Orange County, California, Ty won a U17 youth national club championship in 2013 with West Coast FC and placed third in 2014. Ty then went on to play at the NCAA Division II Soc-

cer at BYU-Hawaii where he started as a Freshman. In 2015, Ty transferred to Orange Coast College. He was named Conference Defender of the Year and a First Team All-Conference player. Ty finished his collegiate career at Concordia University of Irvine in 2016 as an All-Conference Team player.

Ty has his Bachelor's degree in Communications and is currently enrolled in his Master's in Coaching and Administration. Ty is a USSF D Licensed coach and is working towards obtaining his USSF C License.



## Assistant Coach Cassie Ulrich

Cassie Ulrich joined the Salt Lake Community College Soccer coaching staff in the Summer of 2020. In the role, Coach Ulrich will focus on the defensive strategy and team management while also working with the goalkeepers for both the Men's and Women's programs.

Originally from Albuquerque, New Mexico, Ulrich is new to Utah. Ulrich played NCAA Division I soccer at the University of New Mexico from 2011-2015 where she captained the team in 2014 and 2015. A two-time All-Mountain West Conference goalkeeper, Ulrich boasts the 2nd most wins in the Lobo program history after starting in 57 matches for more than 5,000 minutes. In her career she totaled

19 shutouts, 198 saves, and ended with a 0.89 Goals-Against-Average.

After she graduated from UNM, Ulrich went on to play soccer and futsal in England at the University of Nottingham while getting her Masters and also trained with the Aston Villa Ladies. Prior to joining SLCC, Ulrich began coaching at the University of Nottingham where she coached soccer, futsal, and the goal-keepers.

Ulrich graduated from University of New Mexico in 2015 with a B.S. in Exercise Science. She then received her M.S. in Management from the University of Nottingham in 2018.


