## Head Coach Sue Dulaney

Sue Dulaney is the most successful coach in the history of Salt Lake Community College's volleyball program, adding several chapters to the program's strong history.

A volleyball coach for the last 34 years, Dulaney's program has been a mainstay in the NJCAA national rankings, with her leading the Bruins to five Region 9 titles and four runner-up finishes. She led SLCC to a share of the Scenic West Athletic Conference title in 2017.

As Dulaney enters her 12th season in Salt Lake, it's easy to reflect on a past that has been filled with winning. The longtime volleyball coach first entered college coaching with Western Wyoming, leading the program from 2000-08. Dulaney compiled a 245-111 record with the program, leading them to the NJCAA National Tournament in 2004.


She started her career on the Wasatch Front with great esteem, leading the Bruins to the SWAC title in her first year. She has posted landmark wins during her career, including her 400th win during the 2015 season. Dulaney has also earned plenty of personal hardware in Taylors-ville, earning six NJCAA district coaching awards.

Dulaney's volleyball career began with a stellar prep career in Wisconsin, followed by an impressive career with the University of Wisconsin. After graduating with a teaching degree, she began her educational career in Wyoming, coaching volleyball, basketball and track with Campbell County School District.

She later left Wyoming to become the head coach at Battle Mountain High School in Vail, Colorado, where she established a successful club program. After a distinguished teaching career, Dulaney left for the Western Wyoming opportunity.

Besides her college coaching duties, Dulaney currently coaches an Elite 16 team for Club GSL and was an evaluator for USA Intermountain High Performance in the spring of 2016.

Dulaney is married to her husband, Stewart, who serves as an adjunct professor at Salt Lake Community College. The couple has two college-aged children, Dane and Shea.



### Associate Head Coach Shay Goulding-Meurer

Shay Goulding Meurer was named the associate head coach of the Salt Lake Community College volleyball program in May of 2020. Goulding returns to SLCC after previously leading the Bruins as head coach from 2003-2007.

During her tenure as SLCC's head coach, she was a four-time NJCAA District I Coach-of-the Year and two-time AVCA West Region Coach-of-the-Year. Under her leadership, SLCC went to four NJCAA tournaments and graduated five NJCAA All-American players. In 2007, with a 44-2 record, her team was the NJCAA runner-up.

Goulding left the Bruins in 2008 to take the head coaching position at BYU, where she graduated three AVCA All-Americans and had a Top-20 recruiting class in 2011.

In 2012, Goulding founded 'UP Only High Performance Coaching' and over the last eight years has presented over 100 leadership workshops, coaching clinics, volleyball team camps and mindset boot-camps for coaches and student athletes at the club, high school and college level. The program also serves businesses and organizations coast-to-coast. She is also author of the book, 'From Skill Set to Mindset'.

Goulding played collegiate volleyball for Coastal Carolina University in South Carolina as a middle blocker and outside hitter. She was named team captain and the Chanticleer's 'Most Valuable Player'.

She earned a graduate degree in Exercise Science with an emphasis in Motor Learning and Sport Psychology from Utah State University in 2001. She also holds an undergraduate degree in History from BYU in 1998.

Goulding is from Visalia, California. She served as a volunteer missionary for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints in Santiago, Chile. She loves skiing, biking and has completed an 'Ironman' triathlon.

She is married to her best friend, John Meurer, and they have one son, Evan (2).



### Assistant Coach Mackenzie Gromek

Mackenzie Gromek begins her 6th season on the SLCC Volleyball staff. Gromek graduated from Concordia University-Irvine in 2013, where she earned an undergraduate degree in psychology. Gromek is an Agoura Hills, California, native and began her playing career with Santa Monica Beach Club in 2004. She played her high school volleyball at Agoura High School, where she lettered all four years.

As an Eagle at Concordia, Mackenzie was a key player on the 2012 NAIA national championship team that went 38-0, also contributing to the 2011 national runner-up squad. Gromek was a member of the Eagles squad that set national records with a 76 match win streak between 2012-2013. The Eagles were Golden State Athletic Conference Champions from 2011-2013.

Gromek will focus on the development of middle blockers and overall team blocking. She will also be taking stats for the Bruins.


