# Head Coach

## Isaac Wood

Isaac Wood is in his second season as the head coach of the SLCC Men's-and-Women's Cross Country programs. Wood, who is a well-known figure in the vaunted Utah running community, came to Salt Lake after serving for five years as part of the nationally competitive program at BYU.

In his first year in the program, Wood took the program to incredible heights guiding the women's cross country team to a 3rdplace podium finish in their first year as a program, along with a solid 8th place finish from the men's team at the NJCAA Cross Country Championships.

During that first year of the program's existence, Wood aided well 10+ athletes to NJCAA All-American citations in Cross Country, Indoor Track and Outdoor Track. Three athletes finished 5th place at the NJCAA Indoor or Outdoor Championships in their respective events—Molly Jensen 5th in the Indoor 5000m, Aidan Nielsen in the 3k Steeplechase Outdoors and Kennedy Swain in the 3k Steeplechase as well. Molly Jensen and Grace Tipton both finished All-American in the 3k Steeplechase as well, finishing 7th and 8th, respectively. Molly also finished 7th in the 5000m.

A native of Utah, Wood has grown up around the Track-and-Field community, with his father having served as both an agent representing Olympic runners and as a leader in the USATF. Wood then built his coaching career among some of the nation's best collegiate programs, having begun as a team manager with BYU from 2007-13.

He served as the BYU Track-and-Field Director of Operations from 2016-2020. While at BYU, the Men's and Women's Cross Country teams rose to a level of national powerhouses. Men's Cross Country team finishes while at BYU- 7th, 3rd, 2nd, 1st(National Championship in 2019). Women's Cross Country team finishes at BYU- 11th, 7th, 10th, 2nd. The Track and Field teams were always among the top schools in the NCAA for most qualifiers to the NCAA 1st round and Clayton Young won the NCAA 10k in 2019, while Isaac was on the staff.

Besides coaching experience, Wood also bring leadership experience to SLCC. He served as a member of the NCAA Cross Country Executive Committee from 2014-16. Wood is also the Executive Director of the Run Elite Program, Utah's first professional running organization and coaches many of the best professional runners in the state of Utah.

Wood and his wife, Elise, are parents to a son, Beckett.



# Assistant Coach

## Aiden Carlson

Hailing from San Antonio, Texas, Coach Aiden Carlson was a very successful athlete who posted track times of 14:59 in the 5k, 9:17 in the 3200m, and 4:15 in the mile. He began his collegiate running journey at Brigham Young University, working closely with Head Coach Isaac Wood for two years. Seeking new horizons, Coach Carlson transferred to Arizona State University and later finished his athletic and collegiate. career at Portland State, graduating with a bachelor's degree in Exercise Science.

With a strong academic background in kinesiology, Coach Carlson brings a wealth of knowledge to the team, particularly in the realm of strength and conditioning, and program design. Their expertise will play a pivotal role in elevating our athletes' performance

and overall physical well-being.

Growing up in a family rooted in expertise and service, Coach Carlson draws inspiration from his father, a physician and colonel in the Army, as well as his mother, a devoted parent with a background in family therapy. These values of commitment, patience, and leadership are at the core of his coaching philosophy.

Coach Carlson is excited to contribute their expertise and passion to the Salt Lake Community College athletics family. Their commitment to fostering a positive and empowering environment aligns perfectly with the program's goals, and their presence promises to inspire our athletes to reach new heights both in their athletic endeavors and personal growth.

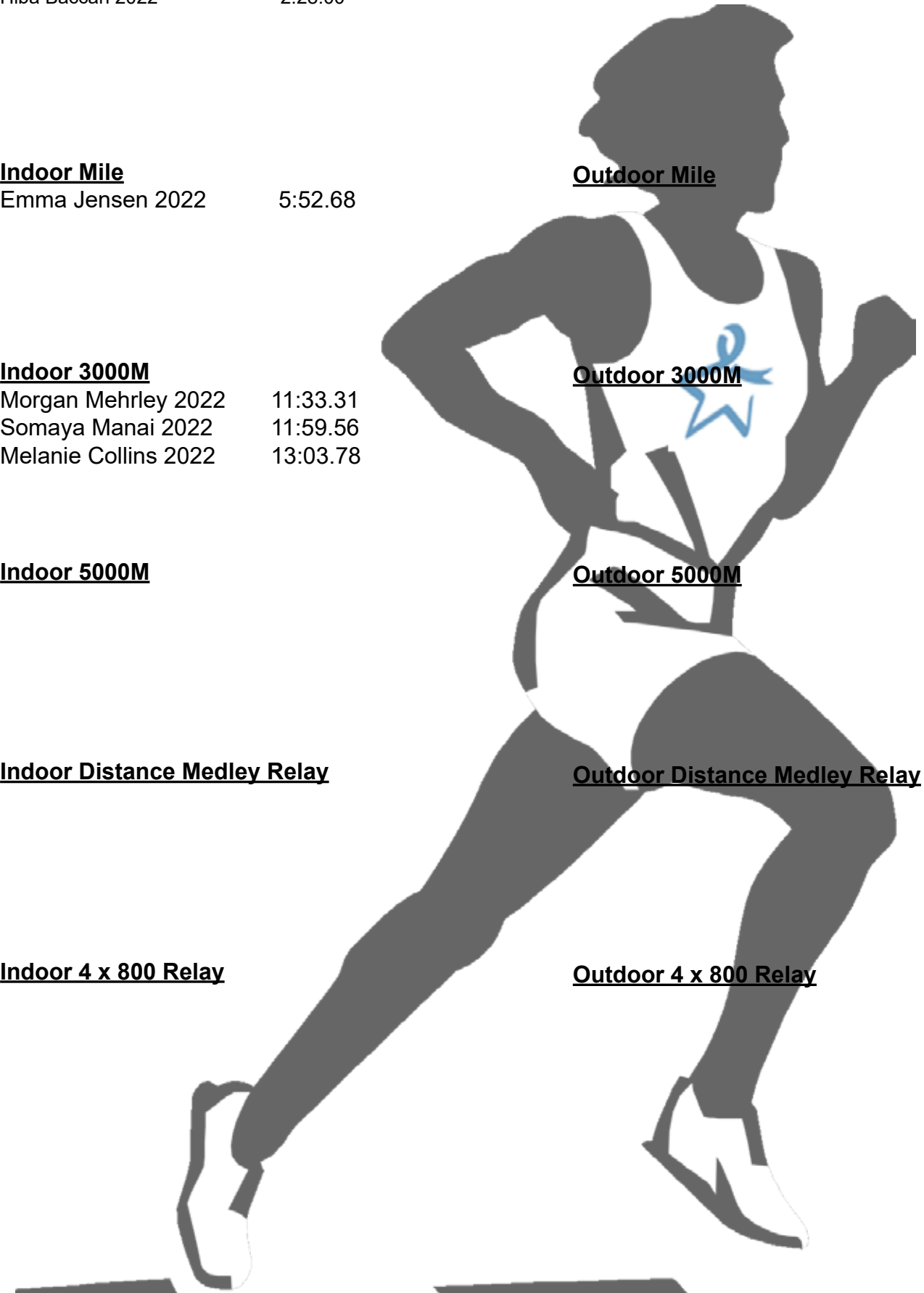

## SLCC President Deneece Huftalin PhD

Dr. Deneece G. Huftalin now serves as the President of Salt Lake Community College and feels privileged to have served the students of Salt Lake Community College for more than two decades in various roles.

Dr. Huftalin joined SLCC in 1992 as the Director of Academic and Career Advising and in 1994 was named Dean of Students. In addition to working with students, she has worked in collaboration with faculty to strengthen learning communities, the first year experience, learning outcomes and inclusivity initiatives on campus. Dr. Huftalin was named Vice President of Student Services in 2004 and served in that capacity until 2014.

In addition to her professional role, Dr. Huftalin is a faculty member for Leadershape, Inc. an international non-profit focused on student leadership development and teaches in the Education, Leadership and Policy program at the University of Utah. Dr. Huftalin serves on the Board of Directors for the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators (NASPA), the leading Student Affairs association. She currently serves as a board member for the Utah YWCA and previously served on the Utah Arts Festival Board.

Dr. Huftalin earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Utah, a master's degree in Education from the University of California, Los Angeles and a doctorate in Education, Leadership and Policy from the University of Utah.

## Vice President of Student Affairs Brett Perozzi Ph.D.

Brett Perozzi is Vice President for Student Affairs at Salt Lake Community College in Utah, USA. He formerly served for five years as Vice President for Student Affairs and ten years as Associate Vice President at Weber State University (WSU). He previously served as Executive Director of Student Engagement at Arizona State University, and has worked at Indiana, Texas Tech, and Colorado State Universities.

Dr. Perozzi holds a Ph.D. from Indiana University and a Master's degree from the University of Arizona, both in Higher Education Administration; with a bachelor's degree in Education from the State University of New York. He has served as a faculty member in the higher education graduate programs at Indiana, Colorado State, Arizona State, and LUMSA University of Rome, and is the cofounder of the Higher Education Leadership program at WSU. Brett has authored dozens of publications in journals, textbooks, monographs, and book chapters. He has published three books, two on the topic of international student affairs and services, and one on student employment during college.

Dr. Perozzi is an active leader with NASPA – Student Affairs Administrators in Higher Education, helping coordinate and shape their global agenda, by establishing a Global Advisory Board, culturally relevant educational programming abroad, and advancing intercultural understanding among those doing student affairs work globally. He has been invited to speak and present on higher education topics worldwide, and seeks to give back to the field through his speaking, writing, and research. Brett is a founding member of the International Association of Student Affairs and Services.

Brett is active in the community through volunteer leadership and board service for organizations such as the cities of Fort Collins, CO and Ogden, UT, United Blood Services, the United Way, and others. Brett and his partner, Teri, enjoy the outdoors and take advantage of their mountain location in all seasons of the year with their Siberian Husky, Akira. They love to travel and explore the world. As a former musician Brett has been involved with many arts events over the years, and seeks out musical endeavors whenever possible.



## SLCC Athletic Staff

Kevin Dustin enters his fifth year as the Athletic Director (AD) of SLCC Athletics.

Officially beginning his duties as of July, 1 2014, Dustin steps into the position at a perfect time as all five SLCC athletic programs are coming off highly successful seasons both on and off the field.

Prior to coming to SLCC, Dustin served as the Assistant Director with the Utah High School Activities Association (UHSAA). 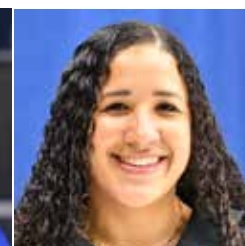
